## Extension of the suspension of activities due to the health emergency in the Local Labor Boards in Mexico City and Nuevo León

Mexico City, May 27, 2020

Mexico City's Local Conciliation and Arbitration Board (Labor Board CDMX) published in its labor bulletin of May 26, 2020 the decree by means of which it orders an extension to the suspension period due to the Covid-19's health emergency, same which will be prolonged until June 14, 2020, therefore remaining closed to the general public. Such period will be considered as non-business days and, consequently, during the referred period procedural terms will not operate.

The Labor Board CDMX also established the following:

- It will only attend ratification of termination agreements and their fulfillment, either within a trial procedure or voluntarily, which were previously scheduled.
- As of June 1<sup>st</sup>, virtual conciliation will be available; guidelines will be published in the Labor Board's website.
- Starting June 8<sup>th</sup>, the electronic "Labor Claim Reception System" (SIREDE) will be available to the public, in order to speed up and make more efficient the reception of individual labor claims, in terms of a User Handbook that will also be published in the Labor Board CDMX website.

Please note as well that the Local Conciliation and Arbitration Board of the State of Nuevo León (Labor Board NL) declared the period comprising from June 1<sup>st</sup> to June 30 as non-business days; during said period procedural terms and deadlines will not operate. The Labor Board NL will resume its regular activities on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020, as long as the competent authorities allow so.
